

Arizona Flood Insurance Quote

Arizona has an average annual rainfall of 12.7 inches which comes during two rainy seasons, with cold fronts coming from the Pacific Ocean during the winter and a monsoon in the summer. The monsoon season occurs from the middle of July through August and brings lightning, thunderstorms, wind, and torrential downpours. It is rare for tornadoes and hurricanes to occur in Arizona, but there are records of both occurring.

In January 1993, heavy precipitation caused extensive flooding in many areas of Arizona and resulted in hundreds of millions of dollars in damage.

If your property is located in a FEMA floodplain, you are required by your lending institution to purchase flood insurance.
